	<p><b>1866, The Hebrew Christian Alliance and Prayer Union of Great Britain</b> Formed to promote the combination of Jewish heritage and Christian theology.</p> <p><b>1884, Joseph Rabinovitch: Jewish philosopher preached the gospel of Jesus</b> In 1884, Rabinovitch published his "Twelve Articles of Faith," which combined traditional and nationalist Jewish ideas with uniquely Christological ones.</p>
	<p><b>1897 (August 29) - First Zionist Congress, Basel, Switzerland</b> [Theodore HERZL presiding... alongside Nathan Birnbaum, Secretary General of Zionist organization Agudath Israel, and previously, founder in 1883 of KADIMAH</p> <p><b>1904 – The Welsh Revival</b> By the end of the first week over 60 responded. By the end of the second week Evan had already started on a whirl-wind tour of the South Wales valleys with his team of 5 girl singers and within a year or so 100,000 converts were said to be added to the Welsh Church...</p> <p><b>1906 - Albert Schweitzer</b> Publishes <i>The Quest of the Historical Jesus</i> (English translation 1910)</p> <p><b>1906-1909 - Asuza Street Revival</b> The Asuza Street revival of 1906-1909 ushered into existence the worldwide twentieth century Pentecostal renewal. The Assemblies of God was born from this renewal.</p>
	<p><b>1947, The Dead Sea Scrolls Discovered</b> Comprising roughly 900 documents, including texts from the Hebrew Bible, discovered between 1947 and 1956 in eleven caves in and around the Wadi Qumran (near the ruins of the ancient settlement of Khirbet Qumran, on the northwest shore of the Dead Sea) in the West Bank. The texts are of great religious and historical significance, as they include practically the only known surviving copies of Biblical documents made before 100 AD, and preserve evidence of considerable diversity of belief and practice within late Second Temple Judaism.</p> <p><b>1948 (May 14) - Establishment of The Third Commonwealth, STATE of ISRAEL, Tel Aviv</b> [Ben Gurion presiding as head of liberator Jewish Establishment... Chaim Weizman, Founding Father... Menachem Begin, head of Irgun... Hatikvah... Star-of-David raised; British exit; six Arab armies immediately attack; Haganah and former Irgun forces are ready - and counter-attack)</p> <p><b>1948, World Council of Churches</b> The World Council of Churches (WCC) is an international Christian ecumenical organization. Based in Geneva, Switzerland, it has a membership of over 340 churches and denominations and those churches and denominations claim about 550 million Christian members throughout more than 120 countries</p>
	<p><b>The "Six Day War" June 5, 1967 (daybreak)</b> Israeli airforce turns-the-tables on its blockading enemies - and catches them off-guard; Israeli warplanes destroy the airforce of Egypt on-the-ground, and by the end-of-the-day, virtually wipe out the airforces of Syria and Jordan, netting the Israelis control of a good portion of the region.</p> <p><b>The "Jesus Movement", 1967</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The "Jesus Movement" was the major Christian element within the hippie counterculture.</li> <li>▪ Members of the movement are called Jesus people, or Jesus freaks.</li> <li>▪ The Jesus movement left a legacy of "Jesus music", which greatly influenced contemporary Christian music.</li> <li>▪ The worship services in the Jesus movement paved the way for the development of modern worship music.</li> </ul> <p><b>1967 – Explosive Growth in "Messianic" Judaism</b> In 1967, there were no Messianic congregations in the world, by 2003, there were at least 150 Messianic congregations in the U.S. and over 400 worldwide. By 1993 there were 160,000 adherents of "Messianics" in the United States and 350,000 worldwide.</p>
